
Presentation on Scoping Paper of National Mechanism of Loss and Damage in Bangladesh

ICAT founded in 2015 provides policymakers around the world with tools and support to measure and assess the impacts of their efforts to climate action primarily to curb GHG emission. ICAT has initiated to broaden its scope to encompass adaptation and provide countries with an M&E framework, and associated capacity building support.

At COP22, ICCCAD with other ICAT partners will engage with experts and negotiators from selected countries to assess national-level demands for an M&E framework on adaptation and to identify means to mainstream such a framework.
