Prof. Khan is also the Programme Director of LDC University Consortium on Climate Change (LUCCC). He is a Lead Author of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC). He also served for four years as UNDP Environment Policy Specialist, working with the Government of Bangladesh. He was Vice Chair of the LDC Expert Group under the UNFCCC during 2002-2004. He attends climate negotiations as the lead negotiator on climate finance with the Bangladesh delegation since 2001. Prof. Khan has written a number of books on climate politics published by MIT Press and Routledge.

Shaila Shahid is serving ICCCAD as Senior Advisor- Climate Change, DRR and Gender. She is the Executive Board member of Gender CC Women for Climate Justice. She is an Advisory Board Member of Stakeholder Engagement Mechanism (SEM), UNDRR Geneva and winner of the Mary Fran Myers Disaster Award for 2019 from the Natural Hazards Centre, Colorado University, USA. She is an environmental lawyer, climate advocate and a World Wild Life Fund (WWF) Fellow with long experience in Disaster Risk Reduction, Integrated Water Resources Management, Climate Change Adaptation, SDGs implementation, Gender mainstreaming and building community resilience.



PROF. SALEEMUL HUQ

Prof. Huq is the Director of ICCCAD at Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) since 2009 and Senior Fellow at the International Institute for Environment & Development (IIED) in London. He is also Senior Advisor on Locally Led Action, Global Centre on Adaptation (GCA) and Advisor of Climate Change Programme at BRAC. He has worked extensively in the inter-linkages between climate change (both mitigation as well as adaptation) and sustainable development, from the perspective of the developing countries, with special emphasis on LDCs. He has published numerous articles in scientific and popular journals, was a lead author of the chapter on Adaptation and Sustainable Development in the third assessment report of the IPCC, and was one of the coordinating lead authors of 'Inter-relationships between adaptation and mitigation' in the IPCC's Fourth Assessment Report (2007). He has been named among the "World's 100 Most Influential People in Climate Policy for 2019" for making a positive difference by The Apolitical,
